

HANSON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS
MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS
Tuesday, March 17, 2026

Chairman Schoenrock, with members Bumgardner, Fox, Kjetland and Waldera present called the regular meeting of the Hanson County Board of Commissioners to order on Tuesday, March 17, 2026.

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

Motion Kjetland, seconded by Waldera to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried.

No conflict of interest.

Motion Waldera, seconded by Bumgardner to approve the March 3rd meeting minutes. Motion carried.

Commissioner Schoenrock reported that he notified the Hwy Superintendent about the gravel hauling trucks on 415th Ave. tearing up the road.

Kenneth Brown joined citizen input concerning the trees that have been torn up along his property after the hwy department used the brush cutter to remove trees in the right of way. David Jarding spoke about the tree roots they cleaned up after the brush cutter was used along their fenceline. Tim Doyle also spoke in regard to having his trees trimmed, Roth is looking to hire a boom truck to clear his trees. As Superintendent Roth was not present at today's meeting, tree removal in the right of way will be added to the next meeting agenda.

Motion Kjetland, seconded by Bumgardner to approve the change order amending the Commercial Asphalt overlay project on 247th St. to pave six miles for a project cost of \$1,337,600.00 at \$95.00 a ton. All members voted aye, motion carried.

Motion Waldera, seconded by Bumgardner to surplus the following items to be sold at a upcoming Wieman auction sale. All voted aye, motion carried. Two 1986 10KW generators, 1987 John Deere backhoe, 2021 Vermeer disc mower, two Monroe one-way truck plows, 1967 hydraulic impact/breaker, Bladerson snow wing, four used 17.5 x 25 motor grader tires, two used 23.5 x 25 loader tires.

Schoenrock presented Fairview Township's request asking the County to spray their township road ditches when needed. It was decided that the county will not be spraying for Fairview Township.

No bids were received for the Asphalt Overlay Patching.

As advertised, sealed bids were opened for the three-mile full depth reclamation project, with base additive, on 247th St. Three bids were filed: Prairie States Trucking, \$127,353.60; Allstates Pavement Recycling and Stabilization, \$99,792.00; Loiseau Construction Inc., \$111,513.60. Motion Waldera, seconded by Fox to accept the low bid from Allstate

Pavement Recycling and Stabilization upon review and acceptance of Superintendent Roth. All voted aye, motion carried.

As advertised, sealed bids were opened for the chip seal and fog seal projects on County Road 01 and 04. Two bids were filed: Bituminous Paving Inc., \$232,715.00; The Road Guy Construction, \$206,000.00. Motion Bumgardner, seconded by Kjetland to accept the low bid from The Road Guy Construction upon review and acceptance of Superintendent Roth. All voted aye, motion carried.

An itemized breakdown of each bid can be viewed in the Auditor's office or at the Hwy Department.

Motion Kjetland, seconded by Waldera to sell the surplus Irregular Tract No. 1 in 10-102-58 to Donald and Janice Huber for \$499.00. All voted aye, motion carried.

Motion Kjetland, seconded by Waldera to approve a PLAT OF TRACT 1 OF SWARTZ ADDN IN THE SW4 OF THE NE4 AND IN THE NW4 OF THE SE4 OF SECTION 10 T102 R58W OF THE 5TH P.M., CITY OF ALEXANDRIA, HANSON COUNTY, SD. All members voted aye, motion carried.

Information was presented on certificates of deposit. Further information will be presented once the Auditor hears back from Legislative Audit to see if the CD's can be classified as Road & Bridge certificates.

Hanson County will follow the State of SD and close all county offices Friday, April 3rd and Monday, April 6th for the Easter holiday.

Reid Kiner, States Attorney, reported that based on the language printed in the bid advertisement, both bids for quartzite material can be accepted. Motion Kjetland, seconded by Fox to accept the quartzite bids from Spencer Quarries and Mitchell Quarry opened on March 3, 2026. Waldera abstained, all others voted aye, motion carried.

David Klingberg, Davison Hanson FSA, joined to ask Hanson County if they would again work together to help control noxious weeds. Motion Bumgardner, seconded by Waldera to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign the MOU between Hanson County Weed & Pest and Farm Service Agency. All voted aye, motion carried.

State law requires that state and local agencies declared noxious weeds be controlled on all land in South Dakota. This is a written agreement between Farm Service Agency and the Hanson County Weed and Pest Department stating that both agencies will work together in enforcing SDCL 38-22-7, 38-22-9. If either agency receives a complaint of noxious weeds on lands affected by FSA programs, they will contact the other and Hanson County Weed and Pest will begin enforcement procedures.
